Curtis Hertel Jr. is pleased to announce that he has received the endorsement of former State Representative and Mayor of Lansing, the Honorable David Hollister. Mayor Hollister joins a growing list of current and former elected officials who have endorsed Hertel as a strong voice for the families and citizens of this district. Hollister served in the state legislature for twenty years before running for mayor of Lansing in 1993, where he served for ten years.
